

Guggenheim Energy & Income Fund Announces Tender Offer

NEW YORK, NY, September 7, 2017 – The Guggenheim Energy & Income Fund (the “Fund”) (XGEIX) announced today a tender offer to purchase for cash up to 2.5% of the Fund’s issued and outstanding shares of common stock. The tender offer will be conducted at a price equal to the Fund’s net asset value per share of common stock on the date on which the tender offer expires. The Fund intends to commence the tender offer on or about Thursday, September 7, 2017, with the expiration of the tender offer currently expected to take place on Friday, October 6, 2017 at 5:00 p.m., Eastern Time, unless otherwise extended.

The tender offer will be made, and the stockholders of the Fund will be notified, in accordance with the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended, the Investment Company Act of 1940, as amended, and other applicable rules and regulations. The tender offer described in this announcement has not yet commenced. This announcement is not an offer to purchase or a solicitation of an offer to buy shares of the Fund. The tender offer will be made only by an Offer to Purchase, a related Letter of Transmittal, and related documents. As soon as the tender offer commences, the Fund will file a tender offer statement on Schedule TO with the SEC, which will include an Offer to Purchase and related Letter of Transmittal. STOCKHOLDERS OF THE FUND SHOULD READ THESE DOCUMENTS BECAUSE THEY CONTAIN OR WILL CONTAIN THE TERMS OF THE TENDER OFFER.
