



Equity Securities and Related Market Risk. The Fund will ordinarily have substantial exposure to common stocks and other equity securities in pursuing its investment objectives and policies. The market price of common stocks and other equity securities in which the Fund invests may go up or down, sometimes rapidly or unpredictably. Equity securities may decline in value due to factors affecting equity securities markets generally, particular industries represented in those markets or the issuer itself. Equity securities generally have greater price volatility than bonds and other debt securities. Fund Distributions Risk. The distributions shareholders receive from the Fund are based primarily on the dividends it earns from its equity investments as well as the gains the Fund receives from writing options and using other derivative instruments, and selling portfolio securities, each of which can vary widely over the short and long term. The dividend income from the Fund's investments in equity securities will be influenced by both general economic activity and issuer-specific factors. In the event of a recession or adverse events affecting a specific industry or issuer, an issuer of equity securities held by the Fund may reduce the dividends paid on such securities. If prevailing market interest rates decline, interest rates on any debt instruments held by the Fund, and shareholders' income from the Fund, would likely decline as well. Options Risk. There are various risks associated with the Option Strategy. The purchaser of an individual and index option written by the Fund has the right to any appreciation in the cash value of the stock or index over the strike price on the expiration date. Therefore, as the writer of a stock or index call option, the Fund forgoes the opportunity to profit from increases in the stock or index over the strike price of the option. However, the Fund has retained the risk of loss (net of premiums received) should the price of the Fund's portfolio securities decline. Similarly, as the writer of a call option on an individual security held in the Fund's portfolio, the Fund forgoes, during the option's life, the opportunity to profit from increases in the market value of the security covering the call option above the sum of the premium and the strike price of the call but has retained the risk of loss (net of premiums received) should the price of the underlying security decline. Other Derivatives Risk. In addition to options, the Fund may use a variety of derivative instruments in an attempt to enhance the Fund's investment returns or to hedge against market and other risks in the portfolio, including futures contracts, options on futures contracts, forward contracts and swap agreements. The Fund also may use derivatives to gain exposure to equity and other securities in which the Fund may invest. Derivatives are subject to a number of risks described elsewhere in this prospectus, such as liquidity risk, equity securities risk, issuer risk, interest rate risk, credit risk, leveraging risk, counterparty risk, management risk and, if applicable, medium and smaller company risk. They also involve the risk of mispricing or improper valuation, the risk of ambiguous documentation and the risk that changes in the value of a derivative may not correlate perfectly with an underlying asset, interest rate or index. In addition, the securities of other investment companies may be leveraged and will therefore be subject to the same leverage risks. Financial Leverage Risk. Although the use of Financial Leverage by the Fund may result in additional risks and can magnify the effect of any losses. If the income and gains earned on securities purchased with Financial Leverage proceeds are greater than the cost of Financial Leverage, the Fund's return will be greater than if Financial Leverage had not been used. Conversely, if the income or gains from the securities purchased with such proceeds does not cover the cost of Financial Leverage, the return to the Fund will be less than if Financial Leverage had not been used.
