Investment Objective

The Emerging Markets Dividend Strategy Portfolio, Series 31 (Trust) seeks to provide dividend income, with a secondary objective of capital gains.

- **Growth Potential of Emerging Markets:** Investing in a portfolio of securities from companies headquartered in developing nations, the Trust seeks to tap into the growth potential of emerging markets.
- **Lower Correlation:** Emerging markets offer diversification benefits due to their lower correlation to the U.S.³
- **Increased Consumerism:** By 2030 it is estimated that the world's middle class will grow to 5.3 billion people, with much of this growth coming from emerging markets.² A growing emerging market middle class may indicate more discretionary income, which in turn may increase spending.⁴



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Tap into the Growth Potential of Emerging Markets

The global economy is forecast to grow 3.3 percent in 2019 and 3.6 percent in 2020, according to the International Monetary Fund.¹ Emerging markets have been a significant driver of global growth, as seen in the chart below. Emerging economies may be an attractive growth opportunity because their growth is expected to be more than two times higher than that of advanced economies.¹ Key growth drivers include the emergence of a middle class in these economies,² which Guggenheim believes drives consumption, as well as increasing urbanization and favorable demographics such as age, education and income. To provide exposure to the emerging market growth potential, Guggenheim Funds Distributors, LLC created the Emerging Markets Dividend Strategy Portfolio.

GDP OF EMERGING MARKETS & ADVANCED ECONOMIES AS A SHARE OF TOTAL WORLD GDP*





Security Selection

In constructing the Trust's portfolio, the securities were selected based on the following fundamentally based quantitative criteria:

- **Investment Universe:** Starting universe is dividend-paying stocks that trade on a global exchange. Remove names headquartered or incorporated in developed countries or with low daily trading liquidity levels.
- **Multi-Factor Quality Evaluation:** Exclude securities that have a less favorable combination of fundamental criteria of profitability, growth, and valuation to leave more attractive businesses that tend to have better price appreciation potential.
- **Risk Filter:** Exclude securities with the worst price momentum—whose risk profiles outweigh return potential over time.
- **Final Portfolio:** From the remaining subuniverse, select securities with high dividend yields that fall within the diversification limits set on global regions, individual countries, sectors, and market cap size groups.




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Portfolio Allocation

Export growth continues to be a major driver of China's rapid economic growth. Recent developments in relations between the U.S. and China have heightened concerns of increased tariffs and restrictions on trade between the two countries.
